YOU HAVE A **RIGHT** TO



INFORMATION

You are entitled to receive information about your rights and obligations, as well as the procedures that concern you, in a language that you understand. The Department for Reintegration of Repatriated Persons and Foreigners (DRRPF) within the Ministry of Internal Affairs (MIA) is responsible for informing stateless persons about their rights and responsibilities during the integration process, in compliance with the with the Regulation for the Integration of Foreigners, available at: https://gzk.rksgov.net/ActDocumentDetail.aspx?ActID=21006.

This information is available in the Serbian and Albanian languages, as well as in a language that stateless persons understand. Basic integration information is provided to all stateless persons immediately upon obtaining legal status in Kosovo. RESIDE IN THE TERRITORY

You have the right to reside in Kosovo.

Upon being granted the legal status of the stateless person you have been granted legal ground for the stay in the territory. By obtaining the status you are obliged to respect the legislation in force, equally as the citizens. You shall not be involved in any activity that might be against the rules and order.

CIVIL STATUS DOCUMENTS

You can register the facts of birth and death in the municipal civil status registries of your residence Municipal Civil Status Offices in your respective municipality of residence will offer you all services related to registration of birth and death, except the marriage and citizenship rights, in accordance with the Law on Civil Status, Law on Citizenship, and related sub-legal acts.

IDENTITY DOCUMENT

LEJEOENDRIN

Once granted a stateless status, you have the right to apply and obtain a temporary residence Identity Card Equipped with the decision of a person with stateless status you will apply for a temporary residence permit (identity card). Each person applies in person at the Foreigners Division within DCAM at the MIA in Pristina. For stateless children, up to 18 years of age, the application for ID Card issuance is made by his/her legal representative or legal guardian.

The validity of the ID Card is one (1) year, with a renewal opportunity. A request for the extension of an ID card with temporary residence is similar to the initial application, with the precondition of in-person application seven (7) working days before its expiration.

Once the ID Card is issued, you will be enabled to access all other rights.
